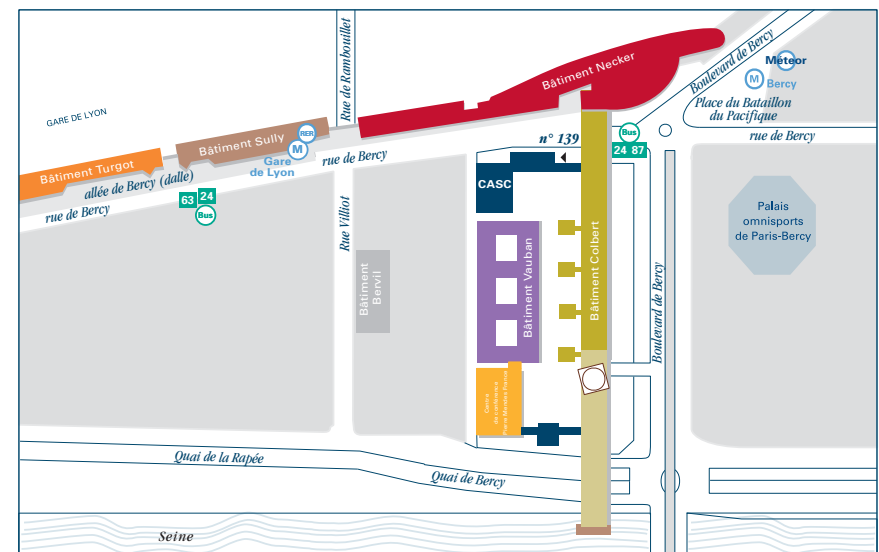
## ETHICS OF PUBLIC MANAGEMENT

In the past two decades, one of the most serious impediments to good governance has been corruption. Consequently, prevention policies have been stepped up in both northern and southern countries. In addition to widely disseminating the democratic model and increasing transparency with respect to public accounts, there have been efforts to introduce genuine citizen-based oversight in terms of ethical public policy and to monitor lobbying activities in order to restore the public's trust.

At a time when world growth is slowing, it is critical for citizens to be able to debate the ethics of public management. Since many have been hard-hit by the economic crisis, they understandably expect their public authorities to set an example in terms of resource management, and financial resources in particular.

The 12<sup>th</sup> International Symposium on Public Management (RIGP) will examine the current situation in a number of countries (Botswana, Croatia, Finland, France, Germany, Poland, Spain and the United Kingdom), identifying, for each one, the forms that corruption takes and the means that the government uses to prevent it. Participants will then focus on public procurement, which can fuel corruption, discussing its integrity and the various ways to make procurement procedures more secure. International organizations (OECD, the Council of Europe and the European Union) and one non-governmental organization (Transparency International) will discuss their supervisory activities or their contributions to improving world governance.
